Amazing, awesome, powerful, and ready to go! Fletcher Academy is starting off with a big bang! God is blessing in so many ways this school of the mountains! We are growing! This newsletter is packed with evidence of what the Lord is doing on our campus and in the lives of our students.

Strawberry Hill has never looked so good. In the above photo stand the 194 students for the 2014-2015 school year. Fletcher Academy is drawing very close to its maximum capacity, and to breaking its personal enrollment record, which stands at 224. Increasing from last year's enrollment of 185 students, Fletcher has become the 2nd largest boarding academy east of the Rockies. This year's enrollment is

the highest it has been in over 30 years, states Principal Terry Pottle.

Fletcher has gained 76 newly enrolled students which is roughly 39% of the student body. Forty-nine of these new students are Freshmen, resulting in the biggest Freshmen class in over three decades. In the past 6 years, enrollment has steadily increased from year to year, without a single decrease.

With this steady increase, the dormitories have found themselves more and more full. There are 65 women lodging in the dorm, and 52 men, this leaves 77 village students—the highest number of village students in 6 years.

The administration and staff are thrilled with the enrollment. Classes are full. Denise Pettit, Choir Director, states, "The first week (*cont. pg. 2*)


