We, the student body of Mountain Sanitarium and Hospital count it a great privilege to be directed by such a gracious lady as Mrs. Gladys Mae Lowder.


She has faithfully aimed and worked for this training school to reach the highest standards in both theory and practice. With courage and trust in God, she has faced and struggled with many an obstacle.




### Principal's Message


In this time of world stress and strain the American objectives of education are being reviewed and the results critically evaluated.
