
Is the church of God going to get the men it needs for this crisis hour?

Our new hospital has a patient capacity of 86 at the present time and includes a new surgery, x-ray, laboratory, and also one of the most extensive physiotherapy departments in the State of North Carolina. We feel we are justified in being proud of this beautiful addition to our campus.
