A NURSE'S PRAYER


I dedicate myself to Thee,


















DEDICATION

The students of 1964-65 will always remember you as a Christian teacher, dean, and above all else, friend.
















Dear Fletcher Students,

The apostle Paul: "What mean ye to weep and break my heart; for I am ready not to be bound only, but also to die at Jerusalem for the name of the Lord Jesus."


