


In Memoriam

U.S. CONGRESSMAN ROY A. TAYLOR HONORS LT. COL. A. C. BUTLER

BUTLER MEMORIAL

On Veterans Day when the nation honored its fallen heros, Fletcher Academy celebrated the event by honoring former Academy student Lt. Col. A. C. Butler, who was killed in action in Vietnam in 1969.

Central figure in the memorial service was North Carolina Congressman Roy Taylor, who dedicated a placque to Col. Butler's memory. He also presented a United States flag that had flown over the White House to Col. Butler's widow, Mrs. Rhoda Butler, of Jackson, Mississippi. In his speech, Congressman Taylor referred to the military career of Col. Butler and how he had been awarded some of the nation's most distinguished medals which include the Legion of Merit, the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Bronze Star, the Air Medal and the Army Commendation Medal.

Also participating in the ceremony were Tom Mallonee, assistant to Congressman Taylor, Jack Williams, institutional president, D. G. Anderson, hospital chaplain, L. E. Nestell, former academy principal, and Paul Witt, director of public relations. In attendance besides the family were friends, faculty and former associates of the family. The family included the mother, Mrs. R. E. Samuels of Jackson, Mississippi, Col. Butler's wife, and his two sons Keith and Ashley; a brother J. D. Butler and his wife; a sister Lola Butler and her husband, Dr. Alvin Bales of Mansfield, Ohio.

The ceremony was followed by a dinner reception for the family in the hospital dining room. The evening prior to the ceremony a similar reception was held in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Walter Koch of Oak Forest. Mrs. Koch was a nursing class mate of Mrs. Bales here in our nursing school.

PLAQUE DEDICATION BY Hon. Roy Taylor

As your representative in Congress I consider it a distinct honor to join with friends, family and former faculty associates of Colonel Butler in paying him this tribute. In doing so I am also mindful of the good will shown by his family in establishing a living and continuing memorial in this hospital that has served the

people of this area with such compassion and devotion. Your generosity will enable the dedicated staff and personnel of this institution to serve humanity with increased effectiveness. I feel that this memorial is one that would have met with Colonel Butler's approval, and you are to be commended.

Actually we can add but little to the honors accorded to this distinguished soldier both while he was living and post humously. For he has been awarded some of his nations highest honors.

Recognizing his ability as a battalion commander many of this nations leading personalities sought him out at his battle station in South Vietnam. These included such men as Secretary McNamara, Walter Cronkite, Joey Bishop, and our fellow Carolinian the Reverend Billy Graham.

I think it appropriate that we too recognize Col. Butler's ability, his devotion, and finally his supreme sacrifice for his country, for his fellow man, and for the principles of freedom that he held dear.
