




## Foreword

In secular life and in the spiritual life there are weights, hinderances to progress, that need to be laid aside.


The ancient Greeks held the Olypian games every four years. Great honor was given to the winners of the foot races and other contest. These contests were as popular as our horse races and automobile races are today.


Perhaps you can not go away




LINDA SCHROEDER






#### Director's Message

For several years we have been hearing about the acute shortage of nurses. The Federal Government, private foundations, nursing organizations, and many other groups have endeavored to reduce this shortage by giving financial aid, by advertising and recruitment, and by other devices. However, a mere increase in the number of nurses will not solve the problem of meeting the needs of suffering humanity. Nurses are needed who have a genuine love for others: Nurses who can forget self in their concern for those who need their help, nurses who are teachers of health, nurses who have such a close relationship to the Great Physician that they can introduce their patients to Him. This kind of person is aptly described in Psalms 84: 5, 6. "Blessed is the man whose strength is in Thee . . . who passing through the valley of Baca make it a well . . ." The term "Valley of Baca" is sometimes translated Valley of Tears, certainly an apt description of the world in which the nurse daily finds herself. She must continually meet suffering, sorrow, and death, but if the spirit of Christ is in her, she will help others find a blessing in even these experiences. It is my prayer that each nurse who goes out from this school may indeed be this kind of person.


Fletcher Academy Alumnus, Carleton Wallace, M.D. is chairman of Fletcher "100" Club.




