Pastor and Mrs. R. G. Beck


Just a few years ago the phrase "Happiness is ——" was frequently used in advertising, and glibly used in every-day conversation, the phrase being completed by whatever words made it appropriate for the particular situation. Someone wrote from a more serious point of view, "Happiness comes not from having easy work, but in the afterglow of satisfaction that accompanies any unselfish task well done." After all the trite "happiness is ——" phrases I found this full of meaning, and think it worth your time to give it some thought.

A state of happiness is a state of being we each desire, but the search for it often leads to the very opposite condition, so from others' experiences we can gain wisdom without making a vain search ourselves. I truly believe that this sought after happiness can be found as we tackle each unselfish task and do it well. The Scriputures give this advice. "Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do it with thy might." Ecclesiastes 9:10. Often we make excuses for not doing well a job that lies close at hand, not making the most of our opportunities, and while the excuses are fresh on our lips, we feel sour, not satisfied, and certainly not happy with ourselves.

Helen Keller, a lady who faced life both blind and deaf, gave this advice, "Face your deficiencies and acknowledge them, but do not let them master you. Let them teach you patience, sweetness, insight. When we do the best we can, we know what miracle is wrought in our own life, or in the life of another."

And very likely the miracle will be that of transforming an unhappy person into a happy, radiant, satisfied individual. The next time you go searching for happiness reflect upon this, give it a try, and expect a miracle. It will happen.

Principal's Message

Dear Students.

Sometimes it is very difficult to be different than the crowd. By nature, we are social creatures who desire the acceptance by our peer group. Such pressures will temp us that it is more expedient to give up our principle or violate our conscience than to lose our popularity with the crowd. And the argument used over and over again to justify our questionable actions is: "Everybody is doing it."

Elijah also felt that "everybody is doing it", when Israel was bowing the knee to Baal. The pressure of being alone was discouraging and he said: "Even I only, am left." (I King's 19:14) But God revealed to him that he was not alone for there were "seven thousand in Israel" who had not bowed unto Baal. The three Hebrew youths and the fiery furnace is another example. Though they stood alone, they not only lived up to what they knew to be right but were willing to die for it. They also found they were not alone for one like unto the Son of God walked with them in the midst of the flame. When they were brought forth not even the smell of fire clung to them. (Daniel 3)

From these illustrations we can learn that even though we may think we are standing alone for that which is right there are others who believe as we do. And when "everybody is doing it" is a violation to our Christian principles and conscience, then we should be strong enough to stand alone instead of becoming a human robot who allows life to be manipulated by the crowd. As Proverbs 4:26,27 reads:

"Ponder the path of thy feet, and let all thy ways be established.

remove thy foot from evil."

In Memorian

Forrest E. Bliss, M.D.

February 9, 1897 - June 21, 1974

Forrest Edgar Bliss was born in Minneapolis, Minnesota, moved with his parents to Blackberry, Minnesota, when he was five, and spent his early boyhood there. He left the farm when he was eighteen years of age to enter nurse's training at Hinsdale, Illinois. He graduated from this school in 1917. A few months later he was inducted into the army. After completion of his army tour he entered Emmanuel Missionary College, Berrien Springs, Michigan.

In 1922 he accepted a call to the then new Mountain Sanitarium and Hospital at Fletcher, North Carolina. Since there was no resident physician, Forrest Bliss was urged to take the medical course. This he did and then returned to Mountain Sanitarium and Hospital in 1933. For the next ten years he remained at the institution, then resigned and opened private practice in Lawndale, North Carolina. In 1963 Dr. Bliss retired because of failing health, and moved back to the Carolina Hills and his old time friends at Fletcher. How we miss this good friend who worked with and for us though the years.


Annie Tallent Witt

November 17, 1886 - October 10, 1974

Dedicated Nurse, Supervisor, Teacher, Friend

Annie Tallent Witt, a native of Athens, Tennessee, came to Mountain Sanitarium and Hospital in the 1920's as an elementary school teacher. In 1929 she entered the first nursing class offered by the institution's school of nursing. After completing her nurse's education she joined the staff of the hospital. She also taught in the school of nursing.

Her philosophy of life stemmed from a heart dedicated in service to her Maker. She loved her work, and her patients never lacked "tender loving care". By her life she seemed to say (with apologies to Emily Dickinson)



If I can stop one heart from breaking I shall not live in vain;
If I can ease one life the aching Or cool one pain,
Or help one soul despairing
To lift his head again,
I shall not live in vain.

Her patients, students, friends, loved ones all, testify that "Mother Witt,, did not live in vain.
