

Principal's Message

Dear Students,

And the argument used over and over again to justify our questionable actions is: "Everybody is doing it."

Elijah also felt that "everybody is doing it", when Israel was bowing the knee to Baal. The pressure of being alone was discouraging and he said: "Even I only, am left." (I Kings 19:14) But God revealed to him that he was not alone for there were "seven-thousand in Israel" who had not bowed the knee to Baal. The three Hebrew youths and the fiery furnace are another example. Though they stood alone, they not only lived up to what they knew to be right but were willing to die for it. They also found they were not alone for one like unto the Son of God walked with them in the midst of the flame. When they were brought forth not even the smell of fire clung to them. (Daniel 3)

From these illustrations we can learn that even though we may think we are standing alone in that which is right, there are others who believe as we do. And when "everybody is doing it" is a violation to our Christian principles and conscience, then we should be strong enough to stand alone instead of becoming a human robot who allows life to be manipulated by the crowd. As Proverbs 4:26, 27 reads:





Principal's Message





Has it been the luke warm, listless, boring, depressing way of indecision and noncommitment?



IN MEMORIAM


Mrs. Elsie Buck Gilman

October 20, 1889—September 14, 1975

Since the early 1930's a familiar sight on Fletcher campus has been the Floyd Gilmans walking hand in hand—to work, to church, to vespers, to programs, to the home of a friend. Today Mr. Gilman walks alone, but not really for memories walk the roads with him.

In memory we go back to the 1930's when Mrs. Gilman acted as head of the sanitarium kitchen. Her work did not end in the kitchen, for she was deeply interested in the total work of the institution and did what she could in those pioneer days to make the plant a going concern. She was personally interested in her students and trained them to serve sanitarium guests superbly. Work traits under her guidance carried over into the tomorrows of their lives.

The Gilman's built their retirement home just off campus. Mrs. Gilman did not lose interest in campus activities. Students through the years have enjoyed her home cooked meals and stories of the early days. Those of us who knew her, worked for her, called her friend, walk today with happy memories of a dedicated life well lived. Director's Message


Is a teacher who moves quietly through the halls of life; Who gives generously of his faith and love as well as of his wisdom; Who leads his students upward through life's day.








In Memoriam

Lelia Viola Patterson


June 16, 1883 - March 22, 1975

Lelia Patterson was born in Dade County, Missouri, the middle child in a family of nine children. For a program in elementary school she was given a poem to memorize titled, "I Want to be a Nurse." She never forgot this poem and determined she would be a nurse. This determination finally led her to Northwestern Sanitarium at Fort Townsend, Washington, where, in 1913, she completed the two year course in nursing offered by that institution. To obtain more experience in her chosen field, she went to Hinsdale, Illinois, and took further training, which she completed in 1915.

Her work kept her at Hinsdale for a time as housekeeper, then she moved to Logansport, Indiana, and opened up treatment rooms with Forrest Bliss. Later she joined Mr. and Mrs. Fred Vaughn and came to Asheville, North Carolina to help open treatment rooms and a cafeteria there. June 15, 1920, Miss Patterson joined the group at Mountain Sanitarium and Hospital, Fletcher, North Carolina—one day before her thirty-seventh birth-

day. From that day until her death, her life was dedicated to the work at Fletcher. She became superintendent of the sanituaium and hospital, and carried on her work until the fall of 1963 when she retired. During those years she delivered more than 300 babies, promoted Good Neighbor Clubs, Garden Clubs, and community work in general.

Lelia V. Paterson: a pioneer in the establishment of our institution; an early worker who had the vision and dedication that it took to help establish such a work; a truly dedicated "Lady with a Lamp."
