
"O.K., sopranos, spit out your gum, dig your heels into the floor and scream!"

This is why we, the annual staff, on behalf of the student body, proudly dedicate this yearbook of 1977-1978 to you - Mrs. Helen Mills Rust.



Message 7o Fletcher Academy Students

What impresses me most about Fletcher Academy is the uncharacteristic loyalty of its alumni. The evidence was demonstrated so clearly on Sabbath morning (October 8, 1977) of Alumni Weekend. I was told that we had the highest attendance on record-approximately 1,100 persons were present.
