








Shouting voices, bouncing balls, and invigorating calisthenics accompany the students as they develop their athletic abilities in the P.E. classes.

Over the past four years these students not only have been classmates, but have become very close friends. The friendships that have developed between these students will last a life time.


As we know, the graduation that means the most to a person is not from college but from academy. We are sure when these students meet again in the years to come, there will be both smiles and tears shared.

We salute this special group of seniors, not only for their achievements now, but for the greater achievements and joy each one of them will bring to the world.






means) because "there are strong bonds between the students." To sum up all questions on the entire subject, Denise Foster simply states, "We're down-right peachy-keen!"


#### Underneath It All
