This year the results were very close. The sophomore class tied with the senior class, but lost out in the end because of their attendance at worship. The night ended with a brilliant display of fireworks.



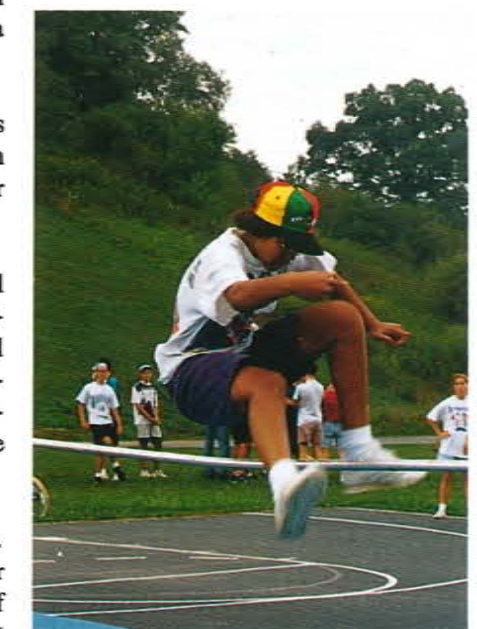
