




As Fletcher Academy is now over 100 years old, we acknowledge that Fletcher is on a long walk!



Even though they were kept so busy they barely had time to breathe, the students ha fun. The whole class got to know each other better and made memories that will last a life













TO GOD BE the GLORY Prayer Conference


Alumni Weekend





The weekend ended with a great breakfast prepared by some of the Seniors. After breaking down camp, the Boys' Club members headed for home with tired feet and a great story to tell!



Most of the people were very generous and a total of 3,100 pounds of food was collected. This will provide 3,100 meals!

The statistics show that in 2010 alone 106,600 different Western North Carolinians needed emergency food aid from MANNA Food Bank's partner agencies. The year before, MANNA distributed 7.6 million pounds of food – enough food for 15,000 meals per day!












































WINTER OLYMPICS


As you walk into the LPC every afternoon you can hear people counting, "five-six-seven-eight!" And then you will probably hear a strong voice critiquing all the moves.








11th HOUR
